

TOGETHER FOR NATURE



The past year has been filled with excitement and achievements as we continue to bring our five-year strategic plan to life.

Each move is an important step forward in making Portland Audubon an increasingly effective and inclusive conservation organization.

Last fall, we opened our doors to the new Marmot Cabin, a 3,200 square foot education facility nestled in our 91-acre wildlife sanctuary in Sandy, Oregon. Kids of all ages and backgrounds are now able to experience immersive nature education year-round through our Outdoor School and camp programs, discovering their love of wildlife and wild places.

We made major strides for wildlife and habitat, putting an end statewide to sodium cyanide bombs targeted at coyotes, banning the bird poison Avitrol on Portland City land, securing funding for the City of Portland to initiate a light pollution reduction scoping project, and realizing a years long goal to build out the Backyard Habitat Certification Program to the entire Portland Metro Area.

We provided in-depth training to our staff on diversity, equity and inclusion to help strengthen our partnerships, better listen to communities who are often underrepresented and most impacted by environmental threats like climate change and pollution, and take a deep look at how we can dismantle systems of oppression in order to build a better future for all people.

We also received a great, unanticipated surprise when the Kehoe family donated 22-acres of forest habitat to the Portland Audubon Wildlife Sanctuary. Thanks to the Kehoes, the City, and generous donors who supported the effort, this gift both protects vital wildlife habitat within the City and provides the public with a safe space to explore and connect with the natural world.

It's always a privilege to take a moment to look back and reflect on everything we've accomplished in the previous year. None of it would be possible without our dedicated community of members, volunteers, donors, activists, community scientists, education participants, Backyard Habitat Builders, and Birdathoners. We look forward to more great achievements in the year ahead within our conservation and education programs. If you would like to learn more about these historic efforts, please let us know.

Marmot Cabin opens its doors for hundreds of youth.

In September, 2018 Portland Audubon celebrated the completion of its newly built Marmot Cabin, a 3,200-square-foot educational camp in Sandy, Oregon, just in time to welcome our first Outdoor School students for the fall semester.

With the new facility, Marmot's capacity tripled, allowing for thousands of kids to experience the magic of Marmot, taking night hikes in our 91-acre sanctuary in search of bats and owls, tracking bears along a stream, learning to understand bird language, and investigating the subtleties of animal tracking.

The reimagined Marmot Cabin allows us to reach more youth from diverse backgrounds and is ADA compliant so that more kids can have access to nature education. The cabin, as well as other upgrades like two 30-foot yurts, transform the facility into a place where kids can comfortably learn, play and explore yearround.

Growing our Wildlife Sanctuary by 22 Acres.

Portland Audubon's Wildlife Sanctuary, located in the hills of NW Portland and adjacent to Forest Park, grew by 22-acres thanks to a generous gift by Portland businessman Marty Kehoe and his family. The property, previously slated for development and appraised at more than \$14 million, will now be restored and protected, adding to the ecological value of our sanctuary and Forest Park.

This expansion would not have been possible without additional support from Portland Audubon donors and the City of Portland who helped pay off the remaining mortgage, a condition of the donation of the land.

Soon, the Bureau of Environmental Services will begin its work to restore the forest, removing invasive species and planting native species, and improving habitat for our resident wildlife like Northern Pygmy Owls, Coastal Giant Salamanders, and Varied Thrush. Once restoration is complete, we will explore adding trails to our network, so that the public can access the property.





OUR SANCTUARIES

Portland Audubon Wildlife Sanctuary

Each year 40,000 people visit our free 172-acre sanctuary to hike our four miles of trails, visit our Wildlife Care Center, shop at our Nature Store, explore our Interpretive Center, and enjoy education and conservation events.

10 Mile Creek Sanctuary

Our 216-acre 10 Mile Creek Sanctuary holds the largest intact stand of coastal temperate rainforest of Sitka Spruce and Western Hemlock in the lower 48 states and is home to the Federally listed Marbled Murrelet and Northern Spotted Owl.

Joe and Amy Miller Wildlife Sanctuary

Bordering the Bull Run Watershed, the 91-acre Miller Wildlife Sanctuary is the perfect place for youth to learn about wildlife, healthy ecosystems, and natural history. Every major forest species of animal found west of the Cascades either inhabits or travels through the Miller Wildlife Sanctuary thanks to our meadow, old growth and secondary growth forest, and creek habitats.

CONSERVATION

Making Oregon a safe and healthy place for people and wildlife.

Through advocacy, grassroots engagement, and long-range planning, our conservation team works across the state to save imperiled species, restore and protect habitat, increase access to nature for all people, create climate resilient landscapes, and make Portland the greenest metro area in the country. All using science, partnerships, and community involvement to achieve a more sustainable future.

Banning Wildlife Poisons

In Portland, City Council banned the use of Avitrol (a bird poison) from lands owned or managed by the City of Portland. On the state level, the governor signed a ban on the use of M-44 sodium cyanide devices.

Fighting Light Pollution

We successfully lobbied for funding for the City of Portland to initiate a light pollution scoping project which will develop recommendations for steps the City can take to reduce light pollution.



Creating a More Just, Climate-Resilient Region

Working with a diverse coalition of community groups, environmental organizations and frontline communities, Portland Audubon helped pass the Portland Clean Energy Fund to fight climate change, create green jobs, and promote environmental justice.

Building Habitat One Yard at a Time

The Backyard Habitat Certification Program expanded to its full potential in the Portland Metro Region, now serving residents in all four counties. 5,629 properties are enrolled for a total of 1,375 acres of habitat.

Protecting the Marbled Murrelet

Portland Audubon, working alongside other conservation groups, won a lawsuit against the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) Commission for reversing its decision to uplist the Marbled Murrelet from threatened to endangered under the Oregon Endangered Species Act.





WILDLIFE CARE CENTER

Giving wildlife a second chance at survival.

The largest and busiest rehabilitation center in the region and the oldest in the country, the Wildlife Care Center rehabilitates injured and orphaned native wildlife, educates the public to reduce human/ wildlife conflicts, and collects valuable scientific data that helps further our conservation initiatives.

We reach millions of people each year, working to create a community equipped with the tools and knowledge to coexist with our wild neighbors.




